This route covers approximately 3km and will take around 1 hour – or longer if you stop for a cake along the way!

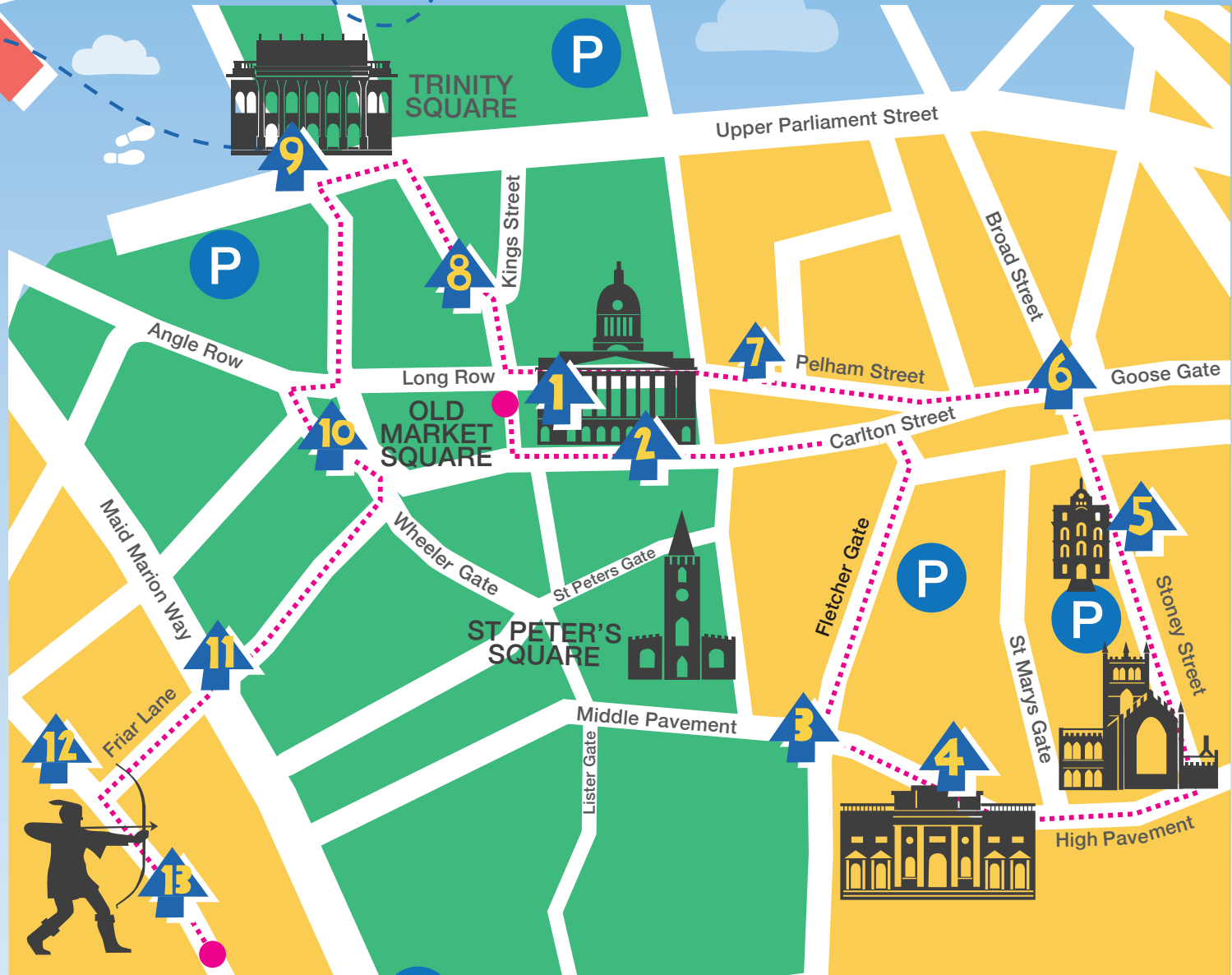

## NOTTINGHAM ADVENTURE TRAIL

**1** Left Lion is a Nottingham landmark and has been a meeting point for nearly 100 years, but today we thought we'd show right lion some love. With your group, take a roar-some selfie with Right Lion to prove we don't have favourites!

**2** Follow the tramline up towards the Lace Market - which mythical beast guards the entrance to the shopping arcade that cuts through to St Peter's Gate?

**3** Continue to follow the path of the tram until you get to the Nottingham Contemporary. Next to the art gallery is Weekday Cross, the historic centre of Nottingham. A handsome red brick building used to be the office and warehouse of a nineteenth century businessman. His name can still be seen above the door. What was it?

**4** Follow the paved street toward the National Justice Museum. Can you find a plaque to Eric Irons outside? What special role did Eric Irons have in history?

**5** Continue up High Pavement and turn left after St Mary's Church. Follow Stoney Street, and look out for the impressive Adams Building - named for Victorian Lace manufacturer Thomas Adams and thought to be the largest surviving example of a Victorian lace warehouse in the UK. There is a green plaque outside commemorating Thomas Adams, what year was he born?

**6** Continue down Stoney Street until you reach Goose Gate. In 2019, to celebrate Pride Nottingham City Council painted a series of rainbows on Broad Street and Carlton Street. How many rainbows can you find?

**7** Head back toward Old Market Square - for the next challenge we need to find the Brian Clough statue. As an extra challenge along the way, see if you can spot a cycle rack.

**8** Brian Clough was a football player and manager who led Nottingham Forest during their most successful period. Let's act out a football goal celebration by the statue!

**9** Head uphill past the statue towards The Theatre Royal and Royal Concert Hall. Plays, concerts and shows have entertained the people of Nottingham at The Theatre Royal since 1865. How many columns are there at the main entrance to the theatre?

**10** Follow the tram lines down Market Street. 'The Bell Inn' on Angel Row claims to be the oldest pub in Nottingham. What year was it established? Hint: You'll need to look high for this one!

**11** It's time to leave Old Market Square - pass the fountains on your left and turn right down Friar Lane to cross Maid Marian Way.
