Hoodwinked, an exciting new Wild in Art public art sculpture trail, has transformed the great city of Nottingham into the playground of Robin Hood – local legend and master of disguise.

From 7 July to 30 September 2018 visit the 33 quirky Robin Hood sculptures. Each is sponsored by a business and individually decorated by artists. Keep your eyes peeled for our infamous outlaw as you've never seen him before!

What's it all about?

The tales tell of Robin's cloak and dagger exploits to outwit the Sheriff of Nottingham. The Hoodwinked trail is a mischievous modern-day twist on these stories of camouflage and cunning. Hoodwinked will see him outwitting the Sheriff again. Robin is everywhere... and apparently nowhere. The Robins are all in plain sight but masquerading in coats of many colours. Will the Sheriff spot him... or will he be Hoodwinked?

Hoodwinked Arts and Literacy Education Programme

Robin's Tales – Where stories take flight!

Fifty-two schools from across Nottingham joined the excitement of Hoodwinked through the Robin's Tales arts and literacy education programme, which brings the Robin Hood legend to life and re-imagines the tales for a new audience.

Robin's Tales offered schools the chance to decorate their very own BookBench as part of this city-wide learning programme. The BookBenches sit on the Hoodwinked trail, alongside the Robins, in the city centre and neighbourhood spaces, such as libraries and leisure centres. At the end of the trail, BookBenches will return to schools as a permanent literacy "inspiration station." Schools have also participated in a range of other great arts and literacy programmes as part of the project and teachers received free training to support children's reading comprehension and Arts Award.

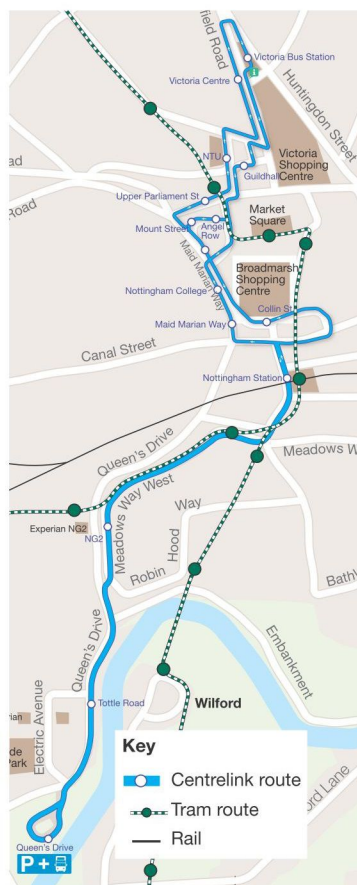

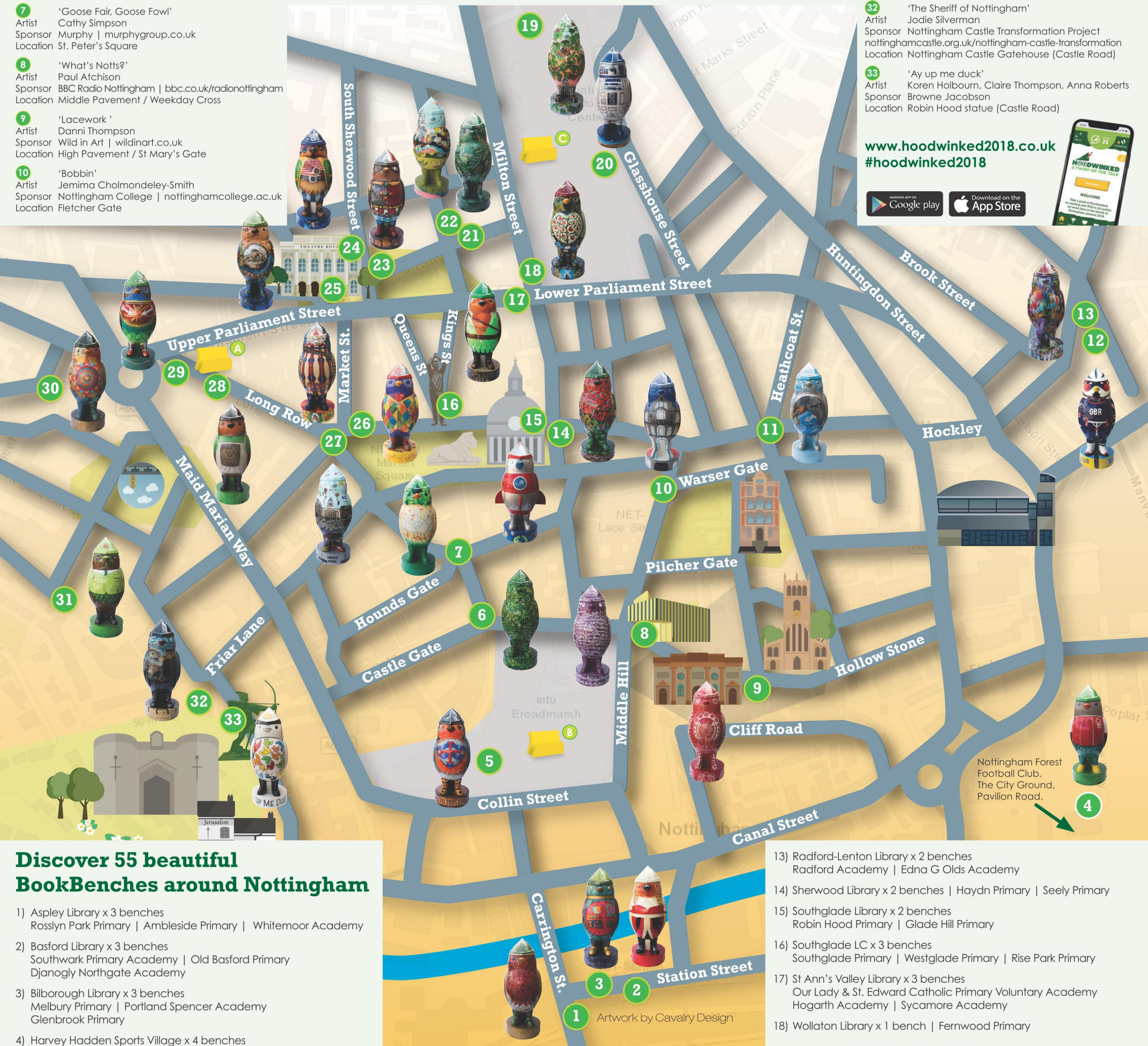
