ROBIN HOOD: LIVING THE LEGEND

Will the real Robin Hood please stand up?

From hell-raising heretics to Hollywood heroes, marauding murderers to men in tights and alienated aristocrats to anthropomorphic foxes, interpretations of Robin Hood's story have captured hearts around the world for over seven centuries.

But who is the man beneath the hood?

He's Nottingham's most famous figurehead - this much we all agree. A legendary outlaw who appears in English folklore from the 1400s and later in literature, theatre and on the silver screen. In popular culture, he's usually depicted as a skilled archer and swordsman, dressed in Lincoln green. He robs from the rich and gives to the poor, a champion of the downtrodden and thorn in the side of the establishment.

But in the hunt for the facts behind the folklore and the history beneath the mystery, everything gets a little murky. Our slippery prince of thieves has eluded scholars for centuries, frequently changing guise as his story is adapted to appeal to new audiences and embellished by the imaginations of those who tell the tales.

Was he a disillusioned lone wolf, or surrounded by a band of bandits? A commoner or nobleman? A literary invention or an amalgamation of real historical figures? Some say he was nothing more than a stock alias used by bandits, the Joe Bloggs of yesteryear.

The truth is, we don't know, and we probably never will. But we're fine with that, and here's why.

Hooded hooligan or on the straight and arrow?

Most people would concede that Robin Hood is an outlaw in one form or another. Some versions of the story describe a man with a penchant for gratuitous violence, certainly not one to shy away from a casual murder or two. Stealing from the rich and swerving the Sheriff, an irreverent rogue who laughs in the face of authority. So far, so bad.

And yet Nottingham places him on a pedestal, both figuratively and physically. What does this say about us? Is the city a hotbed of anarchy, with arrows flying through the streets and visitors getting robbed every time they step outside?

No. Robin Hood is so much more than a common thief; he's a global icon and a hero for our times. He fearlessly challenges injustice and greed, corruption and oppression. He stands up for what he believes in and takes bold measures to make the world a better place. Equality and sustainability are high on everybody's agenda these days and rightly so. Robin Hood embodies these concepts, a tangible figure we can - and should - get behind. Who says a role model has to be a real person?

KEEPING THE LEGEND ALIVE

Of course, visitors are keen to know how they can engage with the legend today, and Nottinghamshire doesn't disappoint. Here are some ideas to get you started:

STAY

Stay at the boutique Lace Market Hotel, which overlooks St Mary's Church where Robin was famously captured by the Sheriff of Nottingham, and the National Justice Museum where he was reportedly held prisoner. This charming Georgian building in the heart of the ancient Lace Market offers a wealth of elegant period features such as original sash windows, fireplaces and a quirky layout.



PLAY

Test your wits in Escapologic's latest escape room, Robin of Locksley, and visit the Robin Hood Stories and Boardgame Museum at Ludorati. Don't forget to grab a selfie with the Robin Hood statue, and drop into the nearby Robin Hood Experience: an interactive, story-based journey over three floors. Then why not try your hand at archery in Sherwood Forest?



EXPLORE

Join the famous outlaw himself on the Robin Hood Town Tour, following a trail of historical facts to discover how simple ballads over 700 years old grew into one of the greatest stories ever told. Visit Sherwood Forest and see Robin Hood's hideout, the world-famous Major Oak, and explore the brand-new visitor centre to learn about the flora and fauna of this beautiful, ancient forest.



LEARN

Peer down into the National Justice Museum's oubliette cell where Robin Hood was imprisoned. Visit St Mary's Church in Edwinstowe where Robin Hood and Maid Marian were supposedly wed. Understand the ways of the woods and how Robin and his Merry Men might have lived with a Bushcraft Course at Sherwood Pines.



TASTE

Stop by at Forest Lodge restaurant, Edwinstowe, for fresh, locally sourced cuisine such as rustic wild mushroom fricassee or beef and ale pie - a feast fit for the rightful King Richard himself! Round off your day with a pint of ale (or two) at Ye Olde Trip to Jerusalem and get a little merry in true Robin Hood style.

SHERWOOD FOREST VISITOR CENTRE AND NATIONAL NATURE RESERVE

The award-winning visitor centre at Sherwood Forest, managed by the RSPB and partners on behalf of Nottinghamshire County Council, offers the perfect gateway to a great day out enjoying the home of Robin Hood and its very special collection of ancient oak trees, wildlife and legends.

The forest is known the world-over for its famous outlaw, and you'll find a host of events themed around him including the annual Robin Hood Festival, which is a week-long event held each summer.



During peak periods, there are guides dressed in traditional medieval costumes, sharing their fantastic local knowledge and stories of Robin and his gang. Look out for story boards throughout the site, telling you how he lived and why a forest home was perfect for an outlaw.

The Major Oak is central to his story – and to every visit! This majestic giant has a canopy spanning 28 metres, a trunk 10m in girth and has watched over this special landscape for more than 800 years.

It's a truly wondrous tree to see in any season and one of almost 1,000 ancient oaks, making this the biggest collection in Europe. Each ancient tree is at least 400 years old and provides homes for hundreds of species – from rare insects to mammals and birds.

Grab a trail guide to wander the forest and find out more about this amazing place!

New for 2020

Follow the progress of the RSPB's work at the former visitor centre. The old buildings have been removed and the forest is being restored to nature. This is a Site of Special Scientific Interest, boasting trees of national importance, which is why the new centre moved to Forest Corner.

The old site is now fenced to protect it as it recovers, but you can watch the transformation at close quarters each time you visit!

Facilities

The Soil Association-certified café offers a host of hot dishes as well as sandwiches, snacks and delicious cakes, including vegetarian and vegan options. There's also a shop stocking everything you need for a legendary visit from toy bows and arrows, to Robin and Marian dressing up costumes and souvenir gifts, t-shirts and books as well as a range of RSPB products. Outside, discover a great Robin Hood themed play area!

The main car park is a short walk away from the centre – use postcode NG21 9QB to find it. All-day parking is £4, or free for RSPB members. Accessible parking is available adjacent to the visitor centre – use NG21 9RN for this.

The new centre is fully accessible for wheelchair users and includes a Changing Places facility with a shower, toilet and a hoist for the safety and comfort of visitors who require extra space and equipment.

The Robin Hood Beer and Cider Festival is one of the UK's largest beer festivals. Work your way through endless casks, sampling the best of Nottinghamshire's revered breweries during this unique four-day celebration.

Amaze your little outlaws by heading deep into Sherwood Forest to witness the family friendly magic of the **Robin Hood Festival**. Enter the mystical forest and see jousting amid a world of Medieval mayhem - all set below the watchful gaze of the Major Oak - Robin Hood's legendary hide out.



Enjoy the scenic banks of the River Trent at August's **Riverside Festival** – a feast of family fun and live music that ends with a mighty bang, as a dazzling firework display lights up the River Trent. Even better – it's completely free for all!

We mark summer's arrival by decamping to the splendid, leafy setting of Wollaton Hall for an almighty outdoor singalong. **Splendour Festival** is now a Nottingham institution, drawing top-tier talent from the past and present, who provide plenty of iconic summer moments.

For a burst of colour and creativity, the **Patchings Festival of Art, Craft & Photography** is a vibrant and inclusive event. Join 250 artists as they demonstrate their arts and crafts.

It's also the anniversary of **Beethoven's 250th Birthday** in 2020 – and in May, Nottingham will programme all 32 Beethoven piano sonatas. Attend the performances and you might even be inspired to tinkle the ivories yourself at the festival's fringe events.

Don't miss the chance to celebrate a delicious Nottinghamshire export - the Bramley Apple. The original Bramley apple tree still stands proudly in picturesque Southwell, and the village comes together each October to pay homage to its internationally savoured apple variety.

GOING UNDERGROUND

DISCOVER A HIDDEN WORLD BENEATH OUR CITY

Sometimes the most intriguing aspects of a place aren't immediately apparent - to discover these gems, you must delve a little deeper. We're going underground to shed some light on a curious cave network, the hidden maze beneath the streets of Nottingham.

After settling in Nottingham in the 7th Century, early inhabitants of the area soon discovered that the soft sandstone terrain was perfect for carving caverns and tunnels. Over the next ten centuries, a maze-like subterranean world was formed, stretching throughout the city. An ancient text dated to 893AD penned in the lost Celtic language Old Brythonic describes Nottingham as Tigguo Cobauc, or Place of Caves.

These industrious inhabitants found all kinds of imaginative uses for the caves over the years, from dwelling places, dungeons and dens of iniquity to secret hideouts, simple storerooms and most intriguingly, a bowling alley.

Today over 800 caves have been re-discovered and documented across the city. Whether you're intrigued by the history and want to explore on a tour, or just fancy a quirky setting for a drink or two, these unique experiences and opportunities to discover the hidden landscape beneath the streets are not to be missed.

CITY OF CAVES

For anyone intrigued by Nottingham's cave system, a trip to City of Caves is a must. Explore some of the oldest surviving caves in the city and discover their fascinating history and uses over the years. From an authentic medieval tannery to an air raid shelter where thousands of people sought refuge during WWII and the remnants of the notorious Victorian Drury Hill slums. Their daily actor-led tours often sell out, so advance booking is advised.

YE OLDE TRIP TO JERUSALEM

Widely known as the oldest inn in the land, Ye Olde Trip to Jerusalem brims with historic charm. Built into the cliffside, the cosy rooms and nooks are carved from the rock on which Nottingham Castle stands, with tunnels extending far and deep beneath. Tourists and locals alike gather to drink and dine in this richly characterful and historic inn, built into the medieval caves of Castle Rock - an essential part of the Nottingham experience.

MALT CROSS

Nottingham's original Victorian musical hall is one of the few remaining in the country and has a fascinating tale to tell. Their illuminating Heritage Tours provide an intriguing history of the heyday of music hall and includes a trip into the caves beneath, which were first recorded in the 11th century when a Carmelite monastery stood on the site. Please note that due to essential repair works the Malt Cross caves are currently closed to the public but are due to reopen in Spring 2020.

PEEL STREET CAVE TOURS

Nicknamed the 'Mammoth Cave' because of its vast size and winding passages, join Nottingham's City Archaeologist Scott Lomax for a unique tour of the labyrinthine cave system of Rouse's sand mine. Discover the fascinating history of the caves, including many little-known facts and anecdotes. Tours run on select dates throughout the year - see whatsonnottingham.com for details and to book tickets.



NATIONAL JUSTICE MUSEUM

Some of the county's most notorious criminals were imprisoned in the caves beneath this 15th-century gaol and Shire Hall. Legend has it that Robin Hood himself was held captive in a deep dungeon cave, later to be rescued by Little John. Descend into the depths of the prison to explore the underground cells, hear tales of crime and punishment from throughout the centuries or check out their varied programme of events, from dramatic trial re-enactments to unique murder mystery evenings.



CAVE ESCAPE

Descend into the city's subterranean world for a truly unique and immersive escapology experience, full of riveting twists and turns, fiendish conundrums, cryptic tasks and puzzles. Choose a lavishly gothic Victorian quest inspired by Bram Stoker's Dracula or join the Monuments Men and Women of WWII on a mission to save treasured artefacts from ruin.



CRESWELL CRAGS

Outside of the city, the ancient caves at Creswell Crags are perhaps the most intriguing and historically significant in Nottinghamshire and beyond. As well as boasting Britain's only known Ice Age rock art which dates back over 13,000 years, in 2018 they also discovered the largest known collection of 'Witches Marks', carved into the cave walls to ward off evil spirits. The museum tells the fascinating story of pre-historic life in Nottinghamshire, with stone tools and artefacts on display. Outside, explore the natural limestone gorge, or step deep inside the caves on their fascinating tours.





EXPLORE PILGRIM COUNTY

2020 marks 400 years since the Mayflower set sail on its perilous journey across the Atlantic to the New World. This remarkable tale, and what happened next, is renowned worldwide, but what of the origins of these brave insurgents? From a modest group of radical religious thinkers in the North Nottinghamshire countryside, to one of the most diverse and powerful nations today, this year we commemorate the story of the Mayflower Pilgrims.



Nottinghamshire's rebel spirit runs deep throughout our history. From the medieval tales of Robin Hood to modern rockers Sleaford Mods, our renegade thinkers have challenged the establishment and disrupted tradition. Few, however, have made as great a wave as the Mayflower Pilgrims, whose determination to worship freely led to the birth of a nation. But how did all of this come about?

During the 16th century, England was in a state of religious upheaval known as The Reformation. King Henry VIII had infamously broken away from the Roman Catholic Church in order to obtain a divorce and added 'Head of the Church of England' to his various regal titles. While Protestant ideas took hold throughout much of the country, over time this new-fangled form of Christianity began to cause rifts in both the clergy and its followers.

Factions arose upholding conflicting beliefs about how Church doctrine should be followed. Puritans believed the Church of England needed further reformation to purify itself of tired religious practices and deep-seated corruption associated with the Roman Catholic Church. In villages around north Nottinghamshire, Lincolnshire and South Yorkshire, small groups of Separatists had more radical ideas and began practicing their worship independently.

After years of increasingly widespread persecution, the situation escalated in 1604 when the King and his bishops set out new legislation that enforced conformity throughout the Church. Separatist ministers were stripped of their positions, while their followers were confronted with suspicion, threats of imprisonment and hefty fines.

Forced to worship in secret, clandestine meetings were held in two key locations within the area now known as Mayflower Country. In the north Nottinghamshire village of Scrooby, a quaint English manor house owned by William Brewster became a secret centre for the Separatists, while 13 miles away in Lincolnshire another congregation met in the grand Gainsborough Old Hall.

As their struggles increased, arrangements were made to leave for the nearby shores of Holland, but this dangerous task was met with setbacks and betrayal. It was not until 1608 that the Separatists finally settled in Holland, where they would stay for 12 years. Still they were outsiders; with a language barrier making skilled work hard to find, and the Dutch way of life becoming normal to their children. By 1620 it was time to move on once again, and so the next chapter in the Mayflower story began.



According to the General Society of Mayflower Descendants, there are approximately 35 million people worldwide who can trace their ancestry back to Mayflower passengers. Even celebrities, including Clint Eastwood, Marilyn Monroe, and Dick Van Dyke, are believed to be long lost relations to those 102 brave voyagers.

Perhaps you have discovered your own pilgrim roots, or maybe this fascinating piece of history has simply piqued your interest - either way, there is much to see and do in Nottinghamshire to learn more.

Go to the Visit Nottinghamshire website to find the Mayflower Trail, which takes you to a number of key sites in the Mayflower story, such as All Saints Church in the village of Babworth and St. Wilfrid's Church in Scrooby. These picturesque countryside churches are where Separatists would have once worshipped and contain original artefacts



relating to the era. For a more in-depth exploration, book yourself a private tour with expert local guide Brackenbury's Britain, who can take you to hidden buildings and byways in the Pilgrim story.

In 2020, Mayflower 400 celebrations will take place across the county, allowing visitors to walk in the footsteps of the Mayflower Pilgrims. Between 3 March - 19 April, Worksop Library presents The Spirit of Mayflower: Language of Sculpture Exhibition by artist Rachel Carter, who crossed the Atlantic by boat following the same route as the Mayflower voyage. The Mayflower Music, Arts & Crafts Festival takes place on 12 July. Among other popular acts it includes '400 Voices', a unique singing project which joins schools and community groups across Nottinghamshire and the U.S.A. Finally, to close the 2020 celebrations, November will see a two-week Pilgrim Festival with events taking place across the Roots region.

These are just some of the celebrations taking place in Nottinghamshire in 2020, but don't forget to check out the Visit Nottinghamshire website to find out what else is happening.

Nestled under the protective covering of scaffolding a world-class heritage destination is waiting to be discovered. Reopening in February 2021 following a 30-million-pound redevelopment, the Castle will become a highlight of Nottingham's cultural and heritage offer.

The must-see heritage site will deliver a vivid and compelling retelling of the story of Nottingham's most famous legend in green tights, Robin Hood. Through an interactive gallery, live actors and a themed outdoor play area, the whole family can experience the life and impact of the heroic outlaw and his companions.

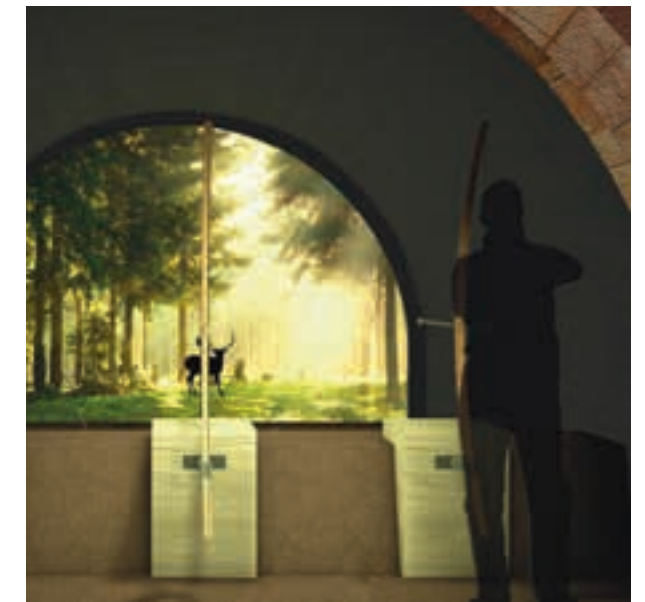
Stories of rebellion, exploring issues around protest and revolution, will highlight the dramatic history of the Castle, covering themes such as the English Civil War, the Luddites, the Suffragettes and the Reform Act Riots. From its life as a royal fortress to being burnt to the ground by rioters in 1831, the Castle's unique story is both thrilling and memorable.

On display in new permanent galleries will be unseen and inspiring collections detailing the rich cultural past of Nottingham as a city. The art galleries will explore the Alabaster, Salt Glaze Ceramic and Lace industries that underpin the city's creative and manufacturing history. The Long Gallery, whose stunningly ornate architecture is a sight to behold itself, will display the best of the collection. A new and improved temporary exhibition space will house major contemporary art exhibitions, giving visitors the chance to see an ever-changing series of impressive exhibitions and offering more reasons to visit time and time again.

The green lungs of the city - the inspiring and scenic grounds of the Castle - will be a welcome retreat from the bustling urban pace of the city centre. From the café balcony, visitors can enjoy an unrivalled view of Nottingham which is both breath-taking and impressive.

But that's not all. Beneath the Castle, hidden to the unsuspecting visitor, lies an intricate network of caves. On a guided tour through the mysterious underworld, visitors will discover ancient dwellings, dungeons, wine cellars and secret escape routes. Set to be the unique and atmospheric location of a diverse annual events programme, the caves will excite and delight visitors of all ages.

The new Castle Visitor Centre will be home to a modern café, selling sensational beverages and a selection of delicious cakes and light bites.



A full day out of fun and exploration, Nottingham Castle will be the essential stop on a visit to the city.

GETTING HERE

Nottinghamshire sits conveniently in the heart of England and getting here is effortless using excellent air, rail and road links from practically anywhere in the UK and beyond.

By road

Major motorways and A-roads make it a breeze to reach Nottinghamshire in the car. Or jump on the National Express coach, with regular services running to Nottingham, Mansfield, Newark, Retford and Worksop.

By rail

High speed trains - operated by East Midlands Railway - whizz from London St Pancras to Nottingham and East Midlands Parkway in as little as 90 minutes, stopping off at towns and cities across the county. EMR trains cover a huge swathe of the country, from Liverpool in the north to Norwich in the east, and the Castle Line connects Nottingham Train Station with Newark Castle - ideal for visiting the National Civil War Centre.

Cross Country Trains also has a wide network, connecting the region with cities as far north as Aberdeen and as far south as Penzance, Cornwall.

Virgin Trains East Coast come from London Kings Cross to Newark. Nottinghamshire is also linked with the continent, thanks to the Eurostar services - which run to Paris, Brussels and Lille from London St Pancras International.

By air

East Midlands Airport has train connections from East Midlands Parkway, which is just 10 minutes from the airport. The regular Skylink bus service hops between the airport and the city, or National Express coaches will also link you with the city centre. Doncaster Sheffield Airport is another option, just to the north of Nottinghamshire, while Birmingham, Luton and Manchester Airports are all easily connected via motorway links.

GETTING AROUND

Public Transport

Nottinghamshire has an excellent public transport system. The city's tram network has been dramatically expanded and offers an easy way to explore the city and suburbs. A tram stop at the train station makes car-free visiting simple.

Nottingham City Transport is the main bus operator within the city, while Trent Barton's network provides connections to attractions like Newstead Abbey. Stagecoach also operates a wide service, covering areas as far north as Retford, and stopping off at places like Sherwood Forest and Rufford Abbey.
