Wild

A daring new dance-circus production in which Motionhouse explores our disconnect with the natural environment, and asks if the wild is still shaping our behaviour in urban lives.

Accessible Activities and Chill Out Zone

Everyone is welcome at Wheee! and Lakeside aims to be fully accessible to people with disabilities. All performances are on level surfaces with the exception of the amphitheatre, but it's possible to view well from the top. Some performances are on grassed areas. This year, visitors will also be able to engage with the following:



VR Swings

One swing is specially adapted for wheelchair use.

Pulse!

On Sunday 2 June the performance will be preceded with a Meet the Cast opportunity at 12.15pm and the performance at 12.30pm will have slightly reduced sound levels which may be helpful for visitors on the autistic spectrum.

Luminarium

The luminarium is fully accessible for wheelchair users, with free carer tickets available.
Parents/carers of visitors with additional Access needs, particularly those who may experience difficulty queuing, should speak to luminarium staff on the day.

Boat House Chill Out Zone

If you would appreciate a little bit of peaceful time away from our lively activities and performance programme, then stroll around past Adventure Golf to the Chill Out Zone by the Boat House. There's space to picnic, withy structures to explore, board games and puzzles to play, and a Paint the Park exhibition to enjoy.

Artist Shamila Chady will be leading drop in workshops using found and natural materials to decorate the trees in the immediate environment.



Getting Here

Finding us

Lakeside is located at the South Entrance of the University of Nottingham's University Park campus, just off the A6005, University Boulevard, about 2.5 miles from the City Centre.

Please note: parking on campus is limited during half-term.

Travel by Tram

The easiest way to get to Lakeside Arts is to use the Toton Lane/Hucknall tram line and get off at the University of Nottingham stop.

You can now get the tram to Wheee! for just £2 with your Lakeside tickets (not applicable for free events). Just make sure you have your Lakeside event ticket with you when you travel and select the 'event return' at the ticket machine.

Alternatively, with Wheee! taking place across the bank holiday and half-term break, purchase a £5 Group Ticket for unlimited tram travel for two adults and up to three children. The special £5 ticket can be purchased at all tram stop ticket machines on the network.

Car parking during Wheee!

Additional free car parking will be available for Wheee! visitors at the University Park West Entrance, in the field behind Florence Boot Hall between Monday 27 May and Sunday 2 June. This site is a pleasant 15 minute walk from Lakeside around the lake, so please allow extra time to reach us.

Blue Badge/Disabled Visitor Parking Bays

There are six Blue Badge/disabled visitor parking bays in the oval car park next to the Pavilion.

Please note: these bays will not be accessible during the Wheee! Family Weekend but disabled parking will be available in the free strip car park adjacent instead.


