Fields of Battle Lands of Peace 14-18 is a unique and engaging street gallery exhibition, based not on the horrors of war, but on how, over time, nature has healed the battlefields.

Containing over 60 photographs taken by photographer and battlefield guide Michael St. Maur Sheil over the past seven years, the project embodies the spirit of the centenary in honouring those who fought, lived and died throughout The Great War.

Developed and curated in partnership with street gallery pioneers Wecommunic8, Fields of Battle is a free public exhibition which brings together stunning present day photographs, archive images and historic facts. The exhibition will tour nationally and internationally until 2018 acting as a gateway to bring the centenary to people in their own communities.

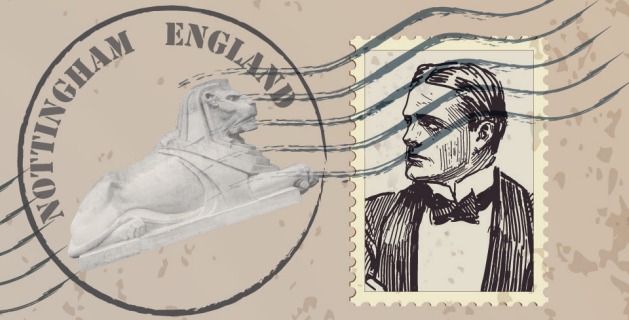
