



Notts Pride takes place in the city centre on Saturday 25 July 2026. During the march, which sets off at midday from Listergate and ends at Sneinton Market, there will be a number of road closures to facilitate safe crossings.

The closures will also affect some transport services in the city, including Nottingham City Transport, trentbarton and NET Tram. Changes to services are also included below.

ROAD CLOSURES

The below streets will be closed for the duration of the march and in place from 11:30 onwards, prior to the March starting at 12:00.

- Low Pavement / Albert Street junction
- Castle Gate / Albert Street junction
- Hounds Gate / Wheeler Gate junction
- Wheeler Gate
- Friar Lane / Beast Market Hill junction
- Fletcher Gate / Victoria Street junction
- Victoria Street
- George Street / Old Lenton Street junction
- George Street
- Old Lenton Street
- Broad Street
- Brightmoor Street
- Nelson Street – **ROAD CLOSED ALL DAY**
- Gedling Street – **ROAD CLOSED ALL DAY**

These roads will be closed from 12:00 until 23:00 to facilitate the large number of people who will be in and around Broad Street.

The below streets will be closed whilst the march crosses from Goose Gate onto Gedling Street (estimated to be from 12:30). These roads will remain closed until the march passes, expected to be open again from approximately 14:00.

IMPACT ON TRANSPORT SERVICES

NET Tram

- To ensure the event is as safe as possible for all attendees, the tram service from Nottingham Station to the Royal Centre will be suspended from approximately 11.30am until 2.30pm.
- The Lace Market and Old Market Square tram stops will be closed during this period.
- All tram services departing from Hucknall and Phoenix Park will terminate at Royal Centre.
- All tram services departing from Clifton South and Toton Lane will terminate at Nottingham Station.

Nottingham City Transport

Some NCT buses will divert while the Pride march makes its way through the city. The diversions have been split into two phases:

Phase 1 – From 11am until approx. 12.30pm

Friar Lane and Beeston Market Hill will be inaccessible to buses, which will affect the following:

Navy 1, 48 and Pathfinder 90

Phase 2 – From 11.30am until approx. 3.30pm

George Street, Bellar Gate and Lower Parliament Street (near the Arena) will be inaccessible to buses, which will affect the following:

Green 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11/C, 12

Lilac 25, 26, 27

Orange 34C

Red 43, 44, 45

Navy 49/B/X

Turquoise 77, 78, 79/A

As Friar Lane will be closed during the march, i4 and indigo will drop off at the lighting shop on Maid Marian Way and pick up outside the Casino on Mount Street.

Meanwhile, skylink Nottingham, skylink express, mainline, the cotgrave and the keyworth will all terminate at Broadmarsh Bus Station.
