



Nottinghamshire Pride takes place in the city centre on Saturday 27 July 2024. During the Parade, which begins at 11am from the junction of Lister Gate and Castle Gate (outside M&S) and ends at Sneinton Market, there will be a number of road closures to facilitate safe crossings. A full list of road closures and approximate timings is provided below.

The closures will also affect some transport services in the city, including Nottingham City Transport and NET Tram. Changes to services are also included below.

PARADE



The Parade is due to take place from 11am. Because of the road crossings and the expected number of attendees, the Parade will be split into 3 waves, with stewards helping to direct those taking part.

ROAD CLOSURES

The below streets will be closed for the duration of the Parade (from 11am):

- Low Pavement/Albert St junction – ROAD CLOSED
- Castle Gate/Albert St junction – ROAD CLOSED
- Hounds Gate, junction with Wheeler Gate – ROAD CLOSED
- Wheeler Gate – ROAD CLOSED
- Friar Lane/Beast Market Hill junction – ROAD CLOSED
- Fletch Gate/Victoria St junction – ROAD CLOSED
- Victoria St – ROAD CLOSED
- George St/Old Lenton St junction – ROAD CLOSED
- George St – ROAD CLOSED
- Old Lenton St – ROAD CLOSED
- Broad St (Old Lenton St end to Carlton St end) – ROAD CLOSED
- High Cross St – ROAD CLOSED
- East St and Western St junction with High Cross St – ROAD CLOSED
- Brightmoor Street – ROAD CLOSED
- Nelson St – ROAD CLOSED ALL DAY
- Gedling St – ROAD CLOSED ALL DAY
- Brook St/Bedford Row junction – ROAD CLOSED ALL DAY

The below streets will be closed whilst the Parade crosses from Goose Gate to Gedling St (estimated to be from 11.30am). Each crossing is estimated to last 15 minutes, with the roads being re-opened for approximately 15 minutes whilst the next wave of the Parade approaches:

- Hollow Stone/Fisher Gate junction – ROAD CLOSED
- Hollow Stone and Plumtre St/Bellar Gate junctions – ROAD CLOSED
- Stoney Street/Hollow Stone junction – ONE WAY AND NO ENTRY SUSPENDED TO FACILITATE DIVERSION ROUTE
- Barker Gate/Belward St junction – ROAD CLOSED
- Hollow Stone – ROAD CLOSED
- Bellar Gate – ROAD CLOSED
- Belward Street – ROAD CLOSED
- Hockley (the street) – ROAD CLOSED
- Lower Parliament Street/Lennox Street junction – ROAD CLOSED
- Lower Parliament Street between Hockley and Lennox Street – ROAD CLOSED
- Lower Parliament Street/Southwell Road junction – ROAD CLOSED
- Kent Street, Rick Street and Howard Street/Huntingdon St junctions – ROAD CLOSED
- Wellington Street, Watkin Street, Great Freeman Street, St Mark's Street, Curzon Place/Huntingdon St junctions – ROAD CLOSED

Please note that all times are approximate and subject to change, depending on the number of attendees and how quickly the Parade waves will move.

IMPACT ON TRANSPORT SERVICES

NET Tram

- To ensure the event is as safe as possible for all attendees, the tram service from Nottingham Station to the Royal Centre will be suspended from 10.30am until 12.30pm
- The Lace Market and Old Market Square tram stops will be closed during this period
- Customer Service Agents will be dispatched to all closed tram stops to help customers

Nottingham City Transport

The Pride Bus will be parked at the top of Hockley, near Carlton Street from approx. 10.45am until the Parade passes, where the team will have a limited exclusive range of giveaways.

NCT buses that usually operate along any of the roads above will be subject to route diversions during the Parade. These include:
