Bramley Apple

Southwell is the home of the much loved English Bramley cooking apple - first cultivated in Southwell over 200 years ago. The original tree is situated in a private garden on Church Street.

A local girl named Mary Ann Brailsford planted some apple pips in 1809, one of which when planted in her family's garden grew to become the very first Bramley apple tree. Local nurseryman, Henry Merryweather took grafts to establish the fruit, naming the apples after Matthew Bramley the owner of the cottage and garden in 1846.

The Bramley is now famous and much loved throughout the world for its unique flavour and excellent cooking qualities. It remains one of the most widely grown British culinary apples. Every October there is a festival to celebrate the Bramley Apple in Southwell.





Markets


Saturday Market 8am – 4pm
